



SUMMER 2021 Guidelines

In light of COVID-19, we wanted to share some updated guidelines and procedures for the upcoming summer. These guidelines are in addition to our normal operating procedures and are subject to change depending on the state of the pandemic, mandates, suggestions and recommendations by the CDC, DHEC and the American Camping Association. As summer approaches, we will be giving more updates frequently. Please feel free to contact our office with any questions.

We are so excited to welcome campers back to camp safely.

As of March 12, 2021

Prior to Camp & Check-In

- Contact Asbury Hills if you have been exposed to COVID-19 within the two weeks prior to arrival.
- Prior to arriving at camp, please monitor your children for temperatures over 100.4 degrees and be on the lookout for other signs and symptoms of COVID-19.
- All Asbury Hills staff will be wearing masks during check-in.
- We recommend bringing your own pen for last minute questions on our forms.
- Staff will be checking temperatures upon arrival. Anyone with a temperature of 100.4 degrees or higher will be asked to leave along with anyone else inside their vehicle.
- Check-in will be a continuous drive through experience. Staff will help unload and move campers into their housing. Parents must remain in or adjacent to their vehicle and we do ask that if you exit your vehicle to wear a mask.
- Campers will wear masks while moving into cabins. (We will limit the amount of time campers wear masks once everyone has settled and been checked in.)

During the Week

- As of today, we are planning on having campers bring one mask for each day at camp. Campers will wear masks upon entering the Dining Hall and until they receive their food and are seated at their tables. When safe distancing is not possible among family groups, campers may be asked by their counselors or staff to wear masks for brief periods of time. *For the vast majority of the day, campers will not be required to wear a mask.*
- Campers will have their temperatures checked and documented every morning and evening. If anyone presents with a temperature of 100.4 degrees or higher, their families/parents will be contacted.
- Social distancing guidelines will be followed with all activities.

Check-Out

- Check-out/pick-up is subject to change as summer draws closer. We will update everyone with these guidelines and procedures moving forward.

Our goal for this summer is to have fun while staying safe and being as transparent as possible. We will continue to stay in touch as things change and summer draws closer.
