

## **GENERAL INFORMATION**

While Asbury Hills is open to the public for hiking during most of the year, we close to the public for the duration of our summer programs. All visitors to property must call the office to schedule a visit & are accompanied by a staff member at all times. We do camp "small-group style" here at Asbury Hills. This means our campers are always in a small group supervised by staff members. Our camper to staff ratio is 1 staff for every 7 campers. There are always two staff members in cabins with campers & with them at daily activities. This way, our campers can enjoy our 2,000 acres of camp all while being supervised by our trained summer staff.

## **MEDICATIONS & HEALTH CARE ON SITE**

For the safety of each camper, the camp must have current medical information on file before the start of camp. The form is available online with camper registration. If health information changes after completion of the form, please call 864.836.3711 to make changes two weeks prior to camper arrival. The Health Care Coordinator & Camp Nurse will review all forms & are available to see campers & parents at check-in. We also have last minute verbal health screening questions as a part of our check-in process, should there be any changes in the two weeks leading up to your session. Please ensure all prescription medications are labeled & in original containers. If medications are not in original containers & following doctor's orders, the medications cannot be dispensed. Medications, including Epi-Pens, that are expired will not be accepted by our Camp Nurse & will return home with the parents.

Over the counter medications will be available for campers through our Camp Nurse. Asbury Hills provides limited accident coverage for each camper from arrival to departure. Camper insurance does not cover camp illness while at camp. Parents are notified if the camper requires medical care off-site.

## **ALLERGIES & DIETARY RESTRICTIONS**

If your camper has any allergies or dietary restrictions, please make sure to list those on camper medication forms.

## STAFF CERTIFICATIONS

We could not provide our summer camp experience without incredible summer staff each year. All summer staff undergo an application process that consists of two interviews with the Summer Camp Director, three reference checks as well as a background check through an external company. Summer Staff are also required to have at minimum a certification in basic First Aid & CPR through a nationally-recognized organization. All of our staff go through a two-week training before campers arrive & our recreation staff have an additional week of training in our ropes course & aquatic elements. All lifeguards are certified through the American Red Cross.

Each week of camp we have a Registered Nurse on-site to administer medications & oversee our campers & staff.
